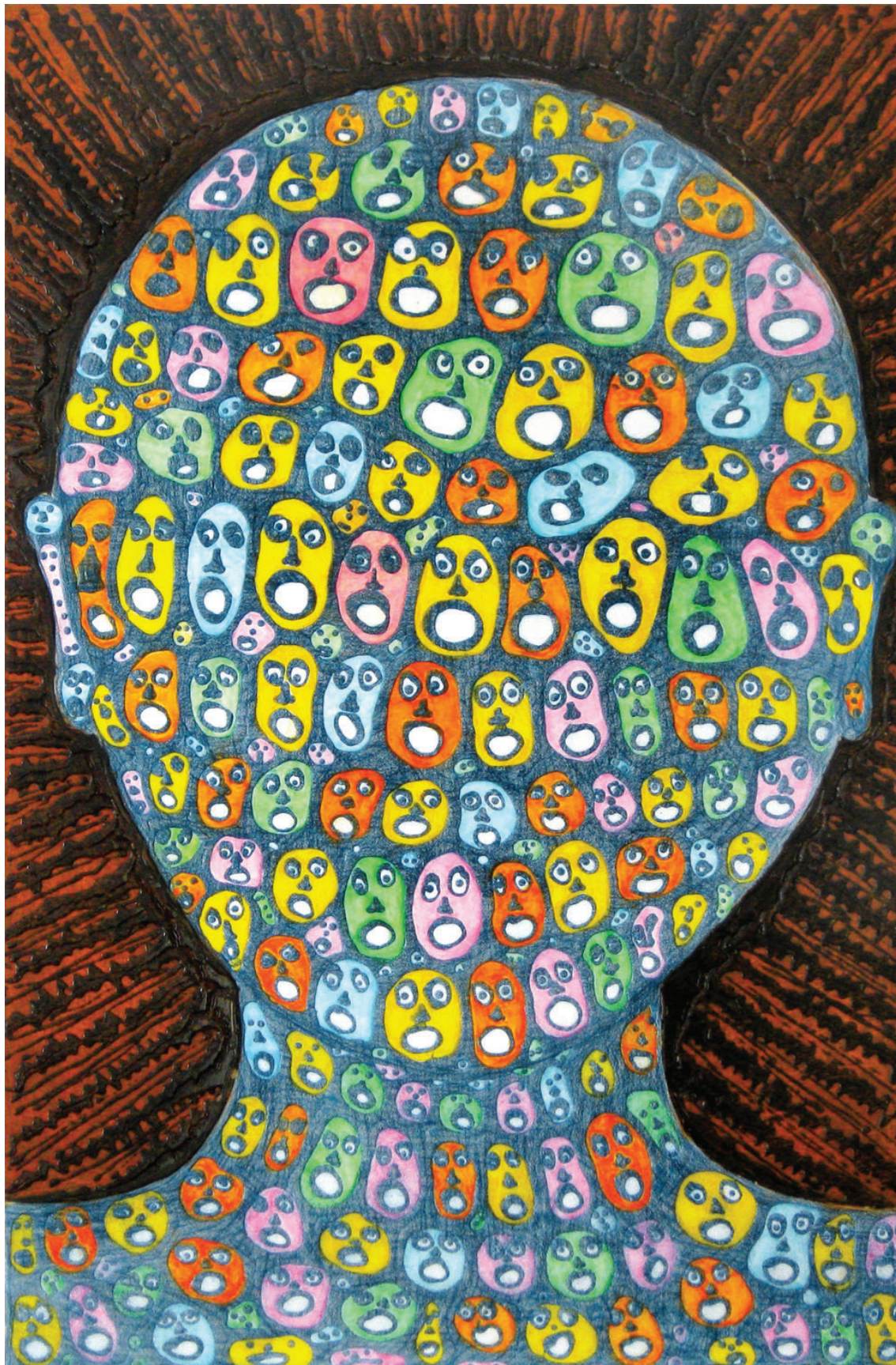

Some years ago, Leftover Salmon and String Cheese Incident were seen as rival forces — both Colorado bands who earned national reputations by making innovations in string music.
